Enhancing Georgia's Migration Management (ENIGMMA)

The project 'Enhancing Georgia's Migration Management (ENIGMMA)' is one of the outcomes of Georgia's continued progress in the implementation of the EU-Georgia Partnership and Cooperation Agreement, the EU-Georgia European Neighbourhood Policy (ENP) Action Plan, the Mobility Partnership and the Visa Facilitation and Readmission Agreements.

The project is funded by the European Union under the Eastern Partnership Integration and Cooperation Programme. The project started in December 2013 and will run until June 2017.

The main objective of the project, which will be jointly managed by the Delegation of the European Union to Georgia (EUD) and the International Centre for Migration Policy Development (ICMPD), in close cooperation with the International Organization for Migration (IOM), is to strengthen the migration governance framework in Georgia in line with the VLAP.

ICMPD, with the strong involvement of experts from EU Member States, will cooperate with the relevant Georgian authorities in capacity building and institutional reform in the following migration management areas:

- **legal migration:** development of a labour migration strategy, circular migration, diaspora involvement, visa policy and public awareness
- **fundamental human rights:** general public awareness raising on human rights, data protection, international protection, human rights issues related to irregular migration, trafficking in human beings and border management
- strengthening of the analytical capacities and knowledge base on migration in Georgia, in particular, in areas covered by the VLAP, including cooperation with academia
- support in the development of an evidence-based migration policy framework, including a comprehensive analysis of the impact of migration on socio-economic development in Georgia
- support in the development of a unified migration data information and analysis system in close cooperation with IOM.
