
EMIGRATION FROM GEORGIA

According to the 2014 population census methodology, a person **was considered an emigrant** if s/he had left Georgia since 1 January 2002 and was absent from Georgia for over 12 months or was planning to stay abroad **for longer than 12 months**.

WHERE DO GEORGIAN CITIZENS EMIGRATE?

According to the 2014 population census, **88,541** emigrants have left Georgia. Most of them are living in **Russia and Greece**.



WHAT IS EMIGRANTS' GENDER DISTRIBUTION LIKE?

Majority of emigrants are women, although the gender ratio varies significantly by current country of residence.





According to the 2014 census, 2 out of 3 emigrants lived in an urban area before departure, while 1 out of 3 lived in rural areas.



People from rural areas emigrate mainly to the neighboring countries, while urban residents emigrate mostly to the USA and EU countries.







75% of emigrants are 20-54 years old.

Emigration is negatively reflected on Georgia's economic and demographic situation and contributes to the decreasing of employable persons in the country and **aging of the population**.
